

# DOHVINCI FAQs

- **My DOHVINCI design didn't harden overnight. What should I do?** If your design feels spongy or dry then it is ready for display (even if it not "hard" to the touch). If the compound still feels soft or wet then it is possible that environmental factors, including humidity, or the thickness of the application of the DOHVINCI compound are affecting drying timing and it may take longer for your design to feel spongy or dry.
- **How long does it take for my DOHVINCI design to dry?** If the compound still feels soft or wet then it is possible that environmental factors including humidity or the thickness of the application of the DOHVINCI compound may be affecting the drying time for your design to achieve the spongy or dry quality. However, you can display your finished projects as soon as you're done designing! Unless purposefully removed by hand or with a tool, the compound will stick to the surface as it dries.
- **What else does DOHVINCI compound stick to?** We've found that it sticks to a number of surfaces! Keep in mind that effectiveness may depend on the quality or chemical make-up of the material. Kids should ask a parent first. And note that compound might stain some surfaces.
  - Wood craft
  - Painted Metal
  - Cardboard
  - Glass
  - Paper
  - Duct tape
- **Does DOHVINCI compound stain?** Most colors won't stain most surfaces, but it's best to do a spot check in an inconspicuous place just to be sure. Teal blue in particular is more likely to stain than others.
- **How can I get my photos to fit in my Memory Masterpiece?** If you're having a hard time sliding your photos into the frame piece, you can simply use tape instead.

- **Are the DECO POP tubes re-sealable?** Yes. Simply twist the cap back on the DECO POP tube when you are done using that color to save it for next time!
- **Are the DECO POP tubes reusable?** No.
- **Are the DECO POP tubes recyclable?** If your local recycling program accepts #5 plastics, then they are recyclable.  
*(Please note this answer depends on your local recycling programs)*
