



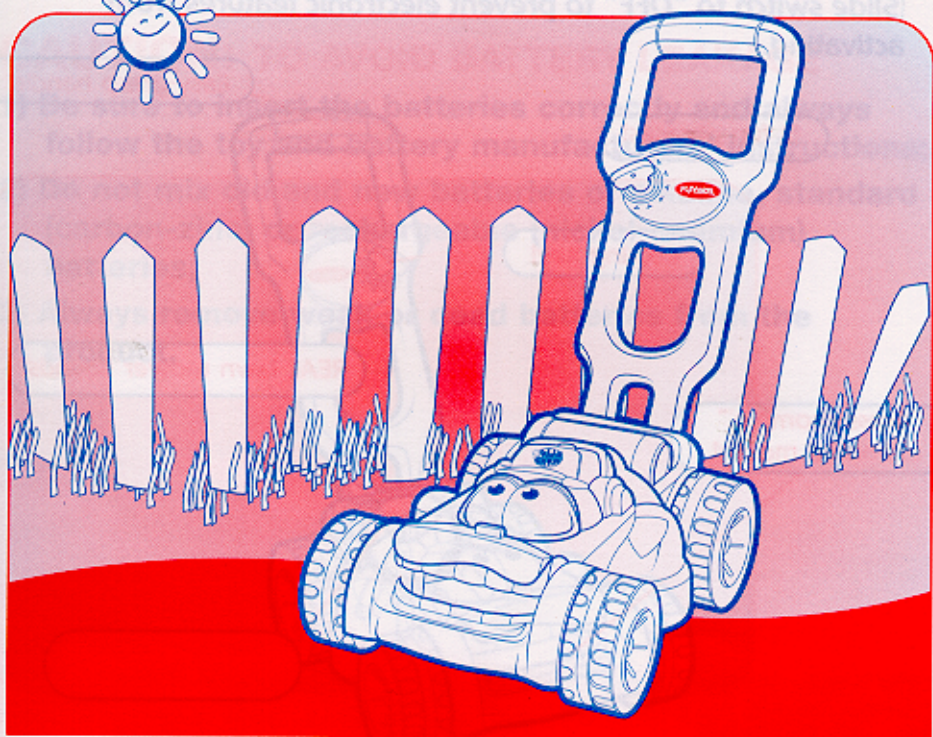

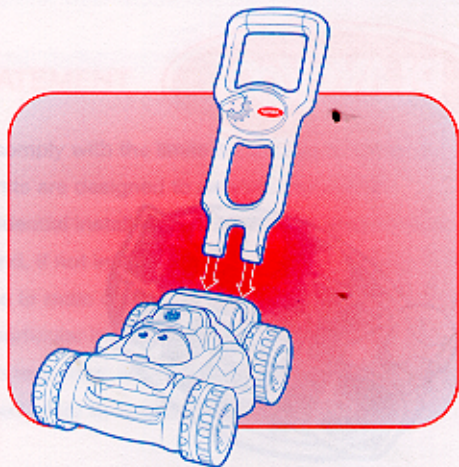

Snap handle onto mower as shown.

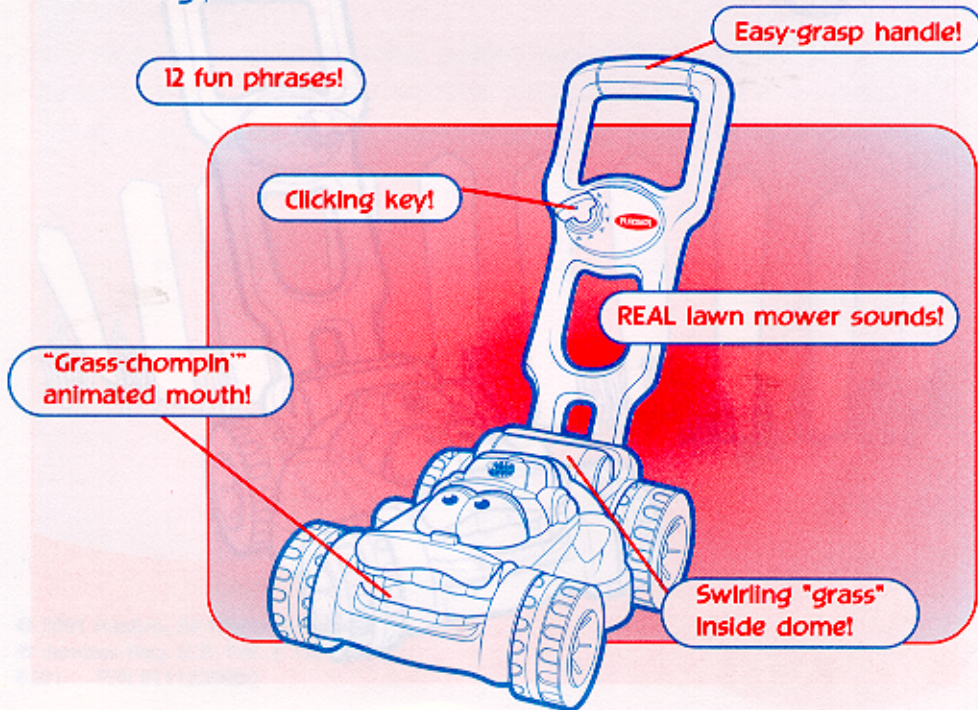


TO PLAY

Big Mike Mower™ is a talking backyard buddy who loves to cut grass!

- Be sure the switch on the bottom of the toy is in the "ON" position to enable the electronic features to work.
- Push Big Mike Mower toy along and he magically comes to life with funny phrases, lawn mower sounds, and delightful animated actions!

(Slide switch to "OFF" to prevent electronic features from activating.)

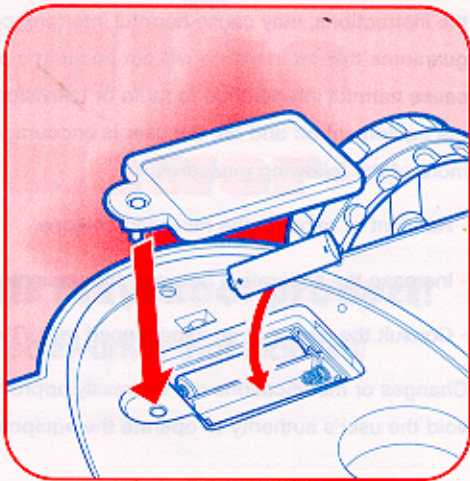


Note: Avoid exposure to water to prevent damaging sound electronics.

This toy simulates the function of a real lawn mower. Please caution your child about the hazards of a real lawn mower.

TO REPLACE BATTERIES

Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door). Remove door. Remove old batteries. Insert 2 fresh "AA" alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw.



CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- 1) Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and always follow the toy and battery manufacturers' instructions;
- 2) Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries;
- 3) Always remove weak or dead batteries from the product.
