on How to Play
Checkers

CHECKERS is played between two opponents.

Each player has twelve men which are placed on alternate squares of the first three rows on each end of the board.

The object of the game is to capture all of an opponent's men, or to block them so that they cannot be moved.

Each player moves one man, alternately, and must jump over and take off the board, an opponent's man when there is a vacant square diagonally behind. Single men can only move diagonally forwards. When a man has reached the last row of the opponent's side, this man becomes a "King," and can be moved diagonally both forward and backward. (A "King" is "crowned" by placing peg of one checker into top of another.)

If several men are exposed by having vacant squares diagonally behind them, they may all be taken at one capture and the taking piece is placed on the vacant

square diagonally behind the last man.
