

CHINESE CHECQUERS

Two, three, four or six persons may take part, each player selecting 10 wooden pieces of the same kind; these are placed in one of the points of the star.

The object of the game is to occupy the opposite 10 holes of the star. The game is played clockwise.

Moves should be made as follows:

By placing one of the pieces into an adjoining empty hole.

By jumping over ONE neighbouring piece to an empty hole behind it.

Players may jump over their own pieces, or over any of their opponents' pieces. No piece is removed from the board before the game is finished.

It is possible sometimes to make two, three or more jumps in one move, but only one piece must be jumped each time. One may move or jump forward, backward or sideways.

If two or four play, players should at the start occupy opposite points of the star, but if three people play, players should use alternate points, leaving the opposite point empty.

If there are four players, two may be partners and help each other along. The player, or the partners who first succeed in occupying the 10 holes of the opposite point, win the game.
