## DECK RING TOSS

PARKER BROTHERS (Inc.) SALEM, MASS., U. S. A., NEW YORK and LONDON

Sole Makers of Monopoly, Finance, Ping-Pong, Camelot, Rook, Pit, Purvis' G-Men Board Game, etc.

Stand from eight to ten feet away from the post.

Each player in turn throws the four rings, one at a time, endeavoring to ring the post.

The count is made as follows:— If all four rings are "posted" it counts the player 10 points. One ring put on counts 1, the next ring thrown on counts 2, the third ring counts 3, i. e. if a player posts three rings in his turn (four throws) he has a score of six, 1 for the first, 2 for the second, and three for the third, or ten points if he posts the four.

The game is won by the player first getting fifty points.

(Where the players are expert the game may be made 75 or 100 points if agreed upon beforehand.)
