The game is for any number of players.

The idea of the game is, by knocking the Birds over by firing the Toy Gun, to obtain as high a count as possible.

These Birds are not real Birds but only imaginary ones from the famous Bird Island of Wozoozoo. Their values in count are 5-10-15-20 and 25, as will show upon the printed block when the Birds are knocked from off the rail.

Place the frame upon a table or the floor. Players stand or sit about five feet away.

Each player has six shots as a turn, all having an equal number of turns.

The count is determined by the numbered Blocks which show above the fence rail as each Bird is knocked over.

The player first scoring a combined count of 250 points WINS THE GAME, or the game may be prolonged or shortened at the discretion of the players.

No bird knocked over can be set again upon the rail until the player has concluded his turn. They are then tipped forward upon the rail and the turn passes to the next player and the game continues as before.

In case any player should run out his score of 250 points before the other players have had an equal number of turns, the play continues until ALL have had their equal turn and in case of more than one player reaching over 250 points, the one having the Highest Total score WINS THE GAME.

THE REPEATING RIFLE

To load the rifle stretch an elastic from the front sight to the spoke on the little wheel at the hammer position. Now pull this hammer back and stretch another elastic to the other one which has come up when the first was pulled back. ~~Do this until six elastics are stretched on the gun. After stretching the sixth elastic do not pull back the hammer.~~




Illustration shows how to load the rifle. To shoot, aim and pull the trigger.

Each player has six shots as a turn, all having an equal number of turns.

INSTRUCCIONES

para el Juego de

FIVE WISE BIRDS

(Cinco Pájaros Sabios)

Este juego es para cualquier número de jugadores.


La Idea del Juego es de arrojar los Pájaros por medio de tiros de la escopeta del equipo y de manera de conseguir la **más alta talla** posible.

Estos Pájaros no son Pájaros verdaderos sino simplemente aves imaginarias traídas de la famosa Isla de Pájaros llamada Woozoo. Sus valores en la talla son 5-10-15-20 y 25, como queda indicado en el pequeño trozo impreso que se expone al derribar el Pájaro de la varilla.

Colóquese el armazón sobre una mesa o en el suelo. Los jugadores se paran o se sientan a distancia de dos metros más o menos.

LA CARABINA DE REPETICIÓN

Para cargar la carabina, estírese una de las bandas de caucho desde la mira del cañón hasta un rayo de la ruedita que está en la posición del percutor. Ahora tira este percutor hacia atrás y estírese otra banda sobre el nuevo rayo que se ha alzado. Repítase esta operación hasta tener seis bandas estiradas sobre la carabina. Al estirar la última de las bandas, no se tira el percutor hacia atrás.



La ilustración muestra la manera de cargar la carabina. Para dispararla, apunte y tire el gatillo.

Cada jugador dispara **seis tiros en cada turno**, y todos tienen igual número de turnos.

La talla se determina por los trozos numerados que queden visibles arriba de la cerca a medida que los Pájaros se vayan derribando.

El jugador que primero alcanza una talla o total de **250 puntos** **GANA LA PARTIDA**, o la partida podrá prolongarse o abreviarse al gusto de los participantes.

No se podrá alzar ningún pájaro derribado hasta concluir el turno del jugador que lo derribó, pero **entonces todos son volteados hacia delante** sobre su varilla y el turno pasa al jugador siguiente para continuar el juego.

En caso de que cualquiera de los jugadores complete su talla de 250 puntos antes de que los demás jugadores hayan completado un número igual de turnos, se sigue el juego hasta que **TODOS hayan tenido igual oportunidad en turnos** y si resulta que más de un jugador alcance o pase los 250 puntos, el que alcance el **total más alto GANA LA PARTIDA**.
