

I N T R O D U C T I O N

HOLLYWOOD GO is one of the most fascinating games to appear in many years. It can be learned in five minutes and the winning combinations are seemingly endless. One of the exciting features of HOLLYWOOD GO is blocking the plays of your adversaries. Chance and skill are nicely balanced and the hidden numbers inject a thrill a minute. The outcome is in doubt until the very last play is made.

The Equipment:

A folding game board divided into squares. Four sets of colored pieces, each set numbered from 1 to 20.

Preparation:

Place the game board within reach of all players.

Each player takes one set of pieces, places them all face down in front of him, and mixes them so that the numbers are unknown to him.

Choose a player to start the game.

The Object:

The idea of HOLLYWOOD GO is to get five pieces of one color in a row in any direction on the board, crosswise or diagonally.

The Play:

The starting player turns up one of his pieces and places it, with the number face up, on any one of the squares on the board.

The other players play in the same manner, clockwise around the board, until one player has 5 pieces of his color in a row, vertically, horizontally,

(OVER)

zontally or diagonally. A player, on his turn, does not have to play adjacent to pieces already on the board, but may play to any open space.

If it is your turn to play and you turn up a number that has already been played by an opponent, you may place your piece on top of this piece with the corresponding number, thus "capturing" his position.

For example: If you should turn up a No. 10 you can place it on any other 10 on the board and capture it. The players following may also cover your piece if they turn up the right number. Only the player whose piece is uppermost may use that space in forming his row of five.

Captured pieces are not removed from the board, they are merely covered by the top piece.

Players are not compelled to cover corresponding numbers, but it is usually a good policy to do so, as you will discover as you become familiar with HOLLYWOOD GO.

The Winner:

The player who first succeeds in getting five pieces of his own color in a straight row in any direction but in directly adjacent squares (either in a horizontal, vertical or diagonal position) Wins The Game.

It can happen, although rarely, that all pieces are used and still there is no winner. In this event the game would be called a draw, and a new game should be played.

Other Games Of HOLLYWOOD GO

Partnership Game

The game is played according to the rules of regular HOLLYWOOD GO. In the partnership game partners sit opposite each other. Each partner plays individually but partners cooperate with each other and may talk with each other and discuss moves throughout the game. The player who first gets five in a row of his own color wins for his partnership.

An Exciting Game For Points

The object is to be first to score 300 points after a series of games. Play remains the same as the Regular Game except that the winning row of 5 pieces has a scoring value.

As each game ends the numbers on top of the winning row are added together as the point score for that game winner.

The first Player to reach a total of 300 points is the Grand Prize Winner.

(Players may agree upon greater or fewer total points.)
