
# KNITTING SPOOL

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

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Thread loose end of yarn through the guide spring from the bottom. Pull yarn through spring until you have ten or twelve inches of loose yarn. Then pass this loose end behind and then around the first pin to the right of the spring. As in illustration.




Continue to next pin (No. 2 in illustration) pass behind it and then loop around and then do the same to the remaining pins. After the last pin is wound push the loose end down through the middle of the spool.

Check the appearance with illustration.




Then take point of knitter and pass it between the two strands of yarn as pictured.

Now carefully lift the original loop up and over the pin being sure not to allow the strand running to the spring to slip over the pin also.



(SEE OVER)



Knitting is continued around and around the spool. Each stitch is made the same as the first.


By occasionally pulling the loose end at the bottom of the spool, stitches are kept uniform.

Continue until you have knit the desired length.

## KNITTING WITH 8 PIN SPOOL:

Knitting is started in exactly the same manner for the 8 Pin spool as for the 4 Pin spool.





### TO CAST OFF:

Hold the spool with the pin on which you've taken the last stitch in front of you. Take the loop off this pin with the knitter and place it over the pin to the left. Then knit the loop that was first on this pin over the transferred loop. Then move the loop to the next pin. Each time it should actually be the same loop moved. After taking the last stitch over it, cut the yarn just below the spring. Now pull the final loop off the last pin and place knitter through it and pull it until the loose end comes out.


#### USING KNIT ROPE:

There is no limit to the variety of colorful and useful articles which may be made from this knit rope.

We suggest the following:



Make 4 loops and sew end to first loop.





Wind thread about center to hold loops together.



Sew button, which matches costume in the middle.
