

Light 'n Learn Grand Piano™

Phillips screwdriver needed for battery placement (not included).

PIANO MODE

In this mode, the piano works as a real, one-octave keyboard. Push the "PIANO" button above, and a friendly voice will ask you to "Play a song!" Then press the piano keys to play whatever you want!

LISTEN MODE

Push the "LISTEN" button, and the voice will ask you to "Pick a song to hear!" Each key is labeled with a picture illustrating the song that key plays. Choose a song, and press the key — as the song plays, the keys light up to show you the notes being played!

The songs, from left to right on the key-board, are:

- 1. "Mary Had A Little Lamb"
- 2. "London Bridge"
- 3. "Are You Sleeping" ("Freres Jacques")
- 4. "Ring Around The Rosie"
- 5. "Hey Diddle Diddle"
- 6. "Row Row Pow Your Boat"
- 7. "Everybody's Cheering"
- 8. "Do Re Mi"

Each song will play twice when selected.

LEARN MODE

Push the "LEARN" button, and the voice will ask you to "Pick a song to learn!" Choose a song and press the key, and the piano keys will light up one at a time to tell you which note to play; just follow the light, and the piano will teach you how to play that song. Each song will play twice when selected.

AUTOMATIC SHUT-OFF


If no key or button is pressed for approximately 1 minute, the Piano will automatically shut-off. To re-activate, simply press any of the 3 top buttons to select a playing mode.


FCC RULES FOR A CLASS B DIGITAL DEVICE



REPLACING THE BATTERIES







Insert 3 "AA" batteries into the compartment, following direction indicators inside compartment. Replace door and re-fasten with the screwdriver.

CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- 1. Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and follow the toy and battery manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Never mix old batteries with new batteries, or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable batteries.
- 3. Always remove exhausted or dead batteries from product.
- 4. Remove batteries if product is stored for a long period of time.
