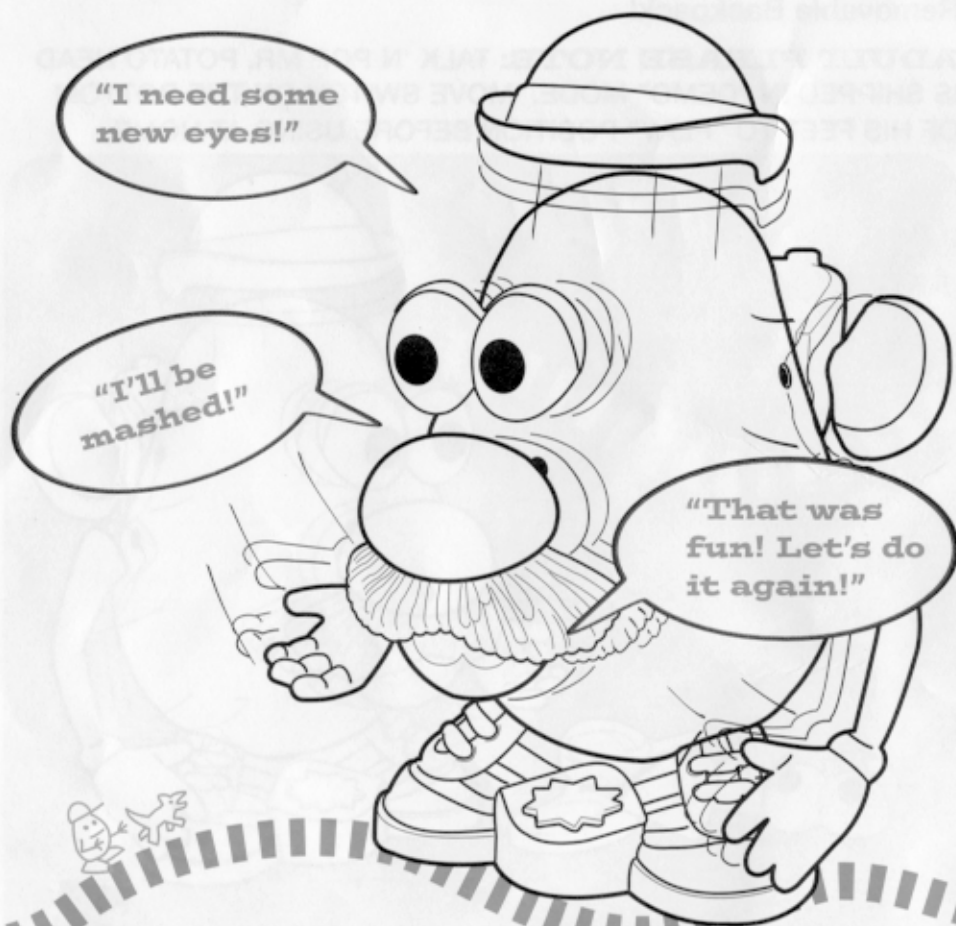

To Play

Talk 'n Pop Mr. Potato Head® is an interactive toy spud who says over 20 "spud-tacular" things! He loves to share a wacky surprise – his parts pop off before your eyes!

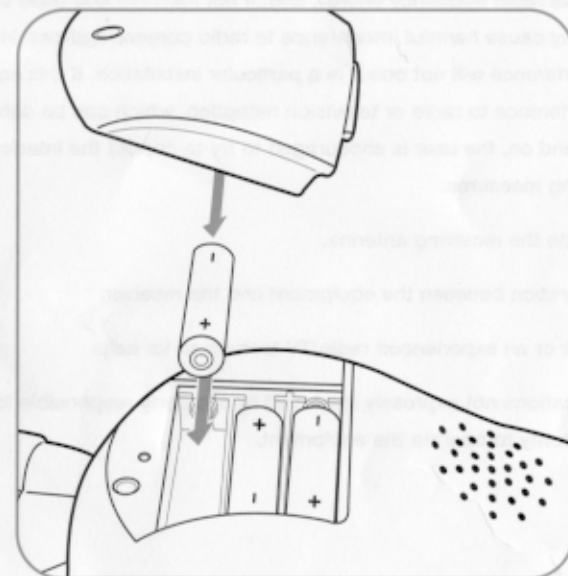
1. Attach the parts to his body...
 2. Press the "POP" button on his feet...
 3. Watch all his parts pop off!
- Reattach the pieces and press the button to start the fun all over again!
 - The removable backpack on the Mr. Potato Head toy stores all the extra pieces after he's been decorated, so nothing gets lost!



To Replace Batteries



Unsnap and remove the backpack from the Mr. Potato Head® toy. Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door). Remove door. Insert 3 fresh "AA" alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw. Reattach backpack.



CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- 1) Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and always follow the toy and battery manufacturers' instructions;
- 2) Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries;
- 3) Always remove weak or dead batteries from the product.
