A Game For Two Players

Each Player takes nine men of one color. The Starter plays first by placing a man on any dot on the board. Then his opponent plays by placing one of his men on any unoccupied dot on the board. Each man placed counts as one turn. After all men are placed on the board they may be moved one at a time, on a player's turn, along a line in any direction where the next dot is unoccupied.

Each player tries, by placing or later by moving the men, to get three in a straight row. If a player succeeds in doing this he may remove one of his opponent's men from the board saying "Pardon Me!" He must not remove one which is in a row of three unless there is no other opponent's man on the board.

When a player has only two playing pieces left he, of course, cannot make a row of three and his opponent Wins The Game.
