How to play

For 2, 3 or 4 Players

Object 0

The object is to be first to get all the ducks of your color under wigwams.

Preparation

Break away the double pictures of ducks and fold along score. Fit each one into a base. The proper number of ducks are then grouped in the playing area and the wigwams are placed in a circle around the ducks.

The number of ducks used in any game depends on the number of players.

The play

The first player spins the spinner. He then takes a number of wigwams equal to the number shown. He places each of these wigwams over one of his colored ducks. Each player proceeds in a like manner. Soon there will be no empty wigwams. At that point a player is entitled to take wigwams off ducks already covered to make up the number shown on the spinner. Naturally, he is trying to pick wigwams which cover his opponents' ducks so that he can cover up more of his own ducks and at the same time uncover those of the other players. When any player spins "MIX UP," all ducks, covered and uncovered, are shuffled quickly around into new positions to confuse and challenge the players.

Winning


The first player to cover all of his ducks is the winner
