

## KEEP PLAYING!

Extend the fun of Neighborhood Memory and help all of your child's natural abilities blossom with these do-together activities.



### DISCOVER

- Spread out the pictures and help your child place them in different categories. For example, sort the pictures into animals, food, or things you can play with.
- Choose four pictures of things you might find in your own neighborhood. Then go for a walk together and try to spot them.

### PERFORM

- Make up a song to sing while you play. For example, "Here is a dog...and here is a doghouse!"
- Pick a picture and act it out together. For example, pretend you're building a snowman or going for a swim.



### CREATE

- Spread out the pictures and practice matching colors. Take turns picking a color, then hunting for all the pictures that include this color.
- Create your own cards. Work together to draw and color pictures of things in your neighborhood, then carefully cut out the centers. Add your cards to the mix next time you play!



### CONNECT

- Mix and match the cards to make silly pictures. Make up a little story about your silly picture.
- Talk with your child about the things in the pictures. Which can you see in your neighborhood? Tell your child about things you remember from when you were growing up.

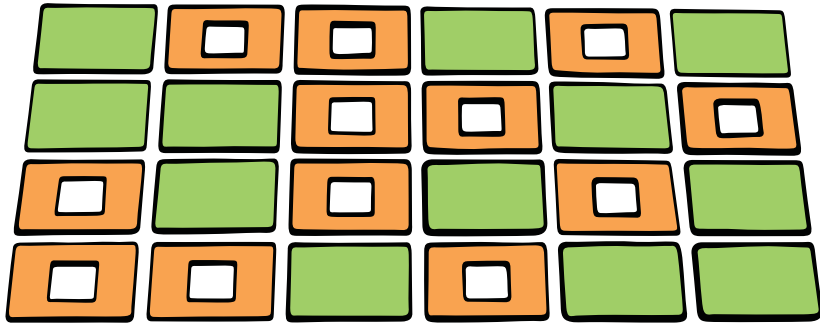

Collect the most neighborhood picture pairs.

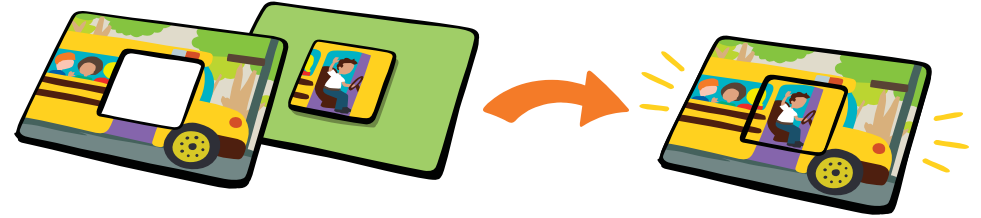
## GET READY

## HOW TO PLAY

On your turn, flip over one green card and one orange card.  
Did you find a match?



- **Yes!** Keep the pair. Now it's the next player's turn.
- **Not this time.** Turn the pieces back over. Now it's the next player's turn.

## HOW TO WIN

The player who collects the most pairs wins!

## FOR BEGINNERS

If you're a beginner, play with the pieces face up and take turns making matches.
