

## KEEP PLAYING!

### DISCOVER

- Use the cards to play seek and find around your house. When you're hunting for the objects, anything goes: You can look for stuffed animals, toys, pictures in books or on clothes — even things in the refrigerator.
- Take a book of cards with you the next time you go to the zoo. See how many things on the cards you can find there!

### PERFORM

- Hunt for animals in the picture that make sounds. Take turns acting like these animals and making their sounds.
- Pick three cards and see how quickly you can find the things on the cards. Then pick three new cards and try to beat your time.



### CREATE

- Hunt for different shapes in the picture. See how many circles, squares, triangles, rectangles, and ovals you can find.
- After you finish the puzzle, use the pen to draw yourself (and your friends, family members, pets, or anything else you want) in the picture.



### CONNECT

- Tell each other stories about what you see in the picture, or make up a story together. What are your favorite things in the picture?
- Go through the alphabet and try to spot something in the picture that starts with each letter. If you can't find something for a letter, make something up or draw it in with your pen!
