

## They're Huge, They're Hungry & They're After You!


- 4 Die-Cut Plant-Eating Dinosaur Play Pieces
- 4 Plastic Play Piece Bases
- 3 Die-Cut Meat-Eating Dinosaurs
- 6 Bones
- 3 Die-Cut Ledges (yellow, red and multi)

Fold-Up Cardboard Cliff

Instructions

### **BEFORE PLAY:**

- 1. Separate all die-cut pieces from the platform and component board.
- 2. Assemble the spinner: see Diagram 1.
  - a. Separate arrow from spinner base.
  - b. Insert base through hole as shown.
  - Snap arrow and spinner base together as shown.
- There are four different Plant-Eating dinosaurs (Stegosaurus, Triceratops, Brontosaurus and Camptosaurus) and four plastic bases. Each player selects a Plant-Eater, folds it and positions it in a plastic base as shown in Diagram 2.



- 4. Each player places his dinosaur at the START space.
- 5. Place the 3 large Meat-Eating dinosaurs (Tyrannosaurus, Deinonychus and Dilophosaurus) in their die-cut paper bases


as shown in **Diagram 3**. Position each one on the X space next to the large colored oval that corresponds to each dinosaur's color. Meat-Eaters should be facing the path.

6. Fold and place the three "ledges" in the die-cut slots on the Cliff as

shown in Diagram 4. The last, or highest

space on the Cliff should be the multi-colored "ledge".

- Bend the Cliff in half and place it at the corner of the gameboard where the path leads — directly opposite of the START corner.
- Place the 6 Bones on the 6 spaces along the path marked with a " ".





### **OBJECT OF THE GAME:**

To be the first player to reach the highest, multi-colored ledge of the Cliff by outwitting the hungry, Meat-Eating dinosaurs.

### TO PLAY:

The youngest player goes first. Each player's turn ends after each spin. The first player spins the spinner and moves his Plant-Eating dinosaur ahead to the colored space indicated on the spinner.

### THE MEAT-EATERS ARE AFTER YOU!

- · If a player lands on a space with a Bone, he picks it up and saves it! Smart Plant-Eaters know that a hefty Bone is the only thing that will help them get past those dangerous Meat-Eaters!
- · If a player lands on one of the 3 Meat-Eating dinosaur spaces, he can do one of two things:
  - 1. If he has a Bone, he can feed it to the hungry Meat-Eater and move ahead one space. Note: Players feed the Meat-Eating dinosaurs by placing a bone in one of the die-cut grooves found in either the Meat-Eater's hand or mouth. If a player lands on a Meat-Eater space and it already has a bone(s) in its mouth or hand, the player must feed it another bone in order to move ahead, or be sent back according to the arrows.
  - 2. If the player doesn't have a Bone, he is sent back according to the arrows indicated on that Meat-Eater's space (Dilophosaurus sends you back to START, Deinonychus sends you back three spaces, and Tyrannosaurus sends you back to the last yellow space).
- If a player lands on a space already occupied by another Plant-Eater, that's OK. Since Plant-Eaters are gentle and don't eat each other, more than one can occupy the same space on the gameboard. Except for the 3 ledges on the Cliff — only 1 dinosaur can occupy a space on the Cliff.


### **HEAD FOR THE HILLS TO WIN!**

The winner is the first Plant-Eating dinosaur to reach the safety of the very TOP multi-colored ledge on the cliff! Meat-Eaters are too big and clumsy to follow their prey up there!

#### **PLANT EATERS:**

Stegosaurus (Steg-e-sor-es), which means "roofed reptile," could whirl around, swing its mighty tail and badly wound any meateater that came near it.



Triceratops (Tri-ser-e-tops), which means "three-horned face," had a head as long as eight or nine feet, weighed as much as an elephant and fought off meat-eaters with its sharp horns.

Brontosaurus (Bront-e-sor-es), which means "thunder lizard," gets its name from its huge feet, which scientists think made a great noise when it walked.



Camptosaurus (Campt-e-sor-es), which means "flexible reptile," travelled in a herd and used to leave his three-toed footprints in the mud.

#### **MEAT EATERS:**

Tyrannosaurus (Te-ran-e-sor-es), which means "tyrant dinosaur." was the meanest, scariest meat-eater and could swallow whole planteating dinosaurs in one gulp.



Deinonychus (Din-o-ny-kus), which means "terrible claw," had big shoulders and long arms that could reach out and catch planteaters in a tight grip.

Dilophosaurus (Dil-o-pha-sor-es), which means "two-ridged reptile," used its tail for balance as it walked and ran on its long and powerful hind legs.
